

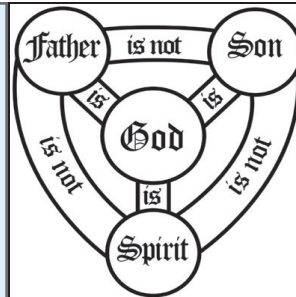

Anointing of the Sick

At least six months advance notice is needed. Please contact the office to start the preparation process.

FATHER'S DAY

We have been created to be baptized "in the name 'of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.'" The word "baptized" means "to be immersed in." The meaning of life is to be immersed in, that is, preoccupied with and consumed by the Holy Trinity.

We enter into Trinitarian love and life through Jesus, the only Way to the Father and the One Who baptizes us in the Spirit. Then the Father reveals the Son, and the Spirit witnesses for Jesus and proclaims Jesus as Lord. We are then immersed within a crossfire of Trinitarian love.

Are you going to go all the way with the Trinity or back out? The Holy Spirit is crying "Abba." Fall into your Father's arms.

From Fr. Mario

FAMILY OF GOD!

In the name of the FATHER, and of the Son, and of the HOLY SPIRIT! The Most Holy Trinity is the Father, the Son Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit. They are the three Divine Persons. But they are not persons in "essence" as we understand from the philosophical viewpoint. They are but one true God. There is no "head and follower" or "first and last" or "superior and inferior." They are one, equal, and united. They manifest themselves through love.

God the Father, out of love, creates, gives life, and sustains. He provides and gives everything so we can live fully and fruitfully. But we rebelled, ran away, fell and sinned. Our God is a merciful Father who desires only the good of His children. So out of His great love for us, the Father sends his only Son.

Jesus reveals to us the words and works of the Father. The Son communicates God's love for us so that we come to know God. We realized the Father's love through the preaching and healing of Jesus, especially through the supreme self-giving on the cross and His rising from death.

We know of the Father's lasting love with the coming of the Holy Spirit. The empowering love of the Holy Spirit assures the continuing presence of the Father and of the saving works of Jesus in our lives. The Holy Spirit sanctifies and strengthens us. The Holy Spirit continues what Jesus did, encouraging us to remember and live the words and works of Jesus and the love of the Father and the Son.

In the Gospel, Jesus commands us to act in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Out of love, the Most Holy Trinity creates, saves, and sanctifies. Jesus sends us to proclaim that Trinitarian love to all nations.

Three Persons equal in majesty, undivided in splendor, yet one Lord, one God! Amazing! What practical implications has the Trinity for you and me?

May those who are moved with compassion to help ...

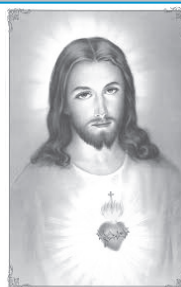
Be strong and take heart

SPIRIT FILLED MEN & WOMEN

The world needs men and women who are not closed in on themselves, but filled with the Holy Spirit. Closing oneself off from the Holy Spirit means not only a lack of freedom; it is a sin. There are many ways one can close oneself off to the Holy Spirit: by selfishness for one's own gain; by rigid legalism – seen in the attitude of the doctors of the law to whom Jesus referred as “hypocrites”; by neglect of what Jesus taught; by living the Christian life not as service to others but in the pursuit of personal interests; and in so many other ways. The world needs the courage, hope, faith and perseverance of Christ's followers. The world needs the fruits of the Holy Spirit: “love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control” (Gal.5:22). The gift of the Holy Spirit has been bestowed upon the Church and upon each one of us, so that we may live lives of genuine faith and active charity, that we may sow the seeds of reconciliation and peace. Strengthened by the Spirit and his many gifts, may we be able uncompromisingly to battle against sin and corruption, devoting ourselves with patient perseverance to the works of justice and peace.

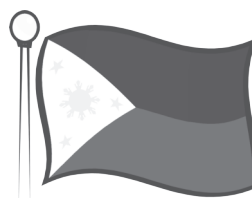
